Sadly, due to ignorance, selfishness and a lack of respect for nature, wolves are nearly extinct in the wild. Mexican Gray Wolves are the most endangered of them all, with only a handful left living in the wild. This is very upsetting to me not only because I love wolves, but also because they are really important to their ecosystems. This was made painfully obvious when wolves were reintroduced to Yellowstone National Park. The wolves literally brought the park back to life. Not only did they help to restore the populations of other animals, but they even changed the landscape. The reintroduction of wolves forced herds of grazing animals to stay on the move, rather than staying in one place so long that they killed all of the vegetation. Before the wolves were reintroduced, the grazing animals had become complacent with no predators to worry about. They would stay in one area for too long and eat everything. This caused the river banks to weaken and collapse, which led to stagnant water.

Once the wolves were back, they restored the natural order of the ecosystem. One of the effects of this was the re-growth of vegetation near the rivers, whose roots strengthened the river banks and helped even the rivers to come back to life. When I learned about this, I thought it was really amazing. Wolves are truly incredible animals who deserve love, respect and protection.
